5/1/09	Our commencement is May 9. No plans to change at this time, but may change as things progress.
5/1/09	Providing hand sanitation stations throughout the venue
5/1/09	General precautions - hand washing, alcohol sprays, nothing elaborate or intrusive
5/1/09	I'm not involved in the decision-making process, but as far as I know we are moving forward with the ceremony scheduled for May 16.
5/1/09	Depends on escalation of the epidemic.
